Poppy Program

Poppy Days have become a familiar tradition in almost every American community. This distribution of the bright red memorial flower to the public is one of the oldest and most widely recognized programs of the American Legion Auxiliary. Millions of red crepe paper poppies—all handmade by veterans as part of their therapeutic rehabilitation—are distributed across the country in exchange for donations that go directly to assist veterans in our communities.

How did the Poppy Program impact a junior when she volunteered for the first time last year. "I am one of the world's largest women's patriotic service organization, named the American Legion Auxiliary... We do various fundraisers and volunteer projects throughout the year to better serve our community and our local veterans. One way we do this is through the Poppy flower distribution that takes place during Memorial Day weekend every year. The Poppy Flowers are assembled by disabled veterans in VA hospitals. Volunteers throughout the country stand outside of local businesses handing out flowers to anyone willing to make a donation of any size... I myself have volunteered to help with the Poppy distribution, along with my grandmother, who is also a member. ..It was an eye opener for me because I got to see how much the veterans really appreciated our effort. During the time we were there, many veterans thanked us for what my grandmother and I were doing. My local unit specifically uses a certain amount of the donated money to be put towards Christmas presents for local veterans. We later make and distribute the presents to veterans in assisted living facilities in my hometown...As we handed the gifts to the veterans, we told them Merry Christmas, thank you for your service, and assured them that they have not been forgotten. It was really cool to see their faces light up with joy when they were given their presents. Being able to give them that joy was an experience I will never forget..."
