Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation by Elvira Moen, Dept. Chairman

The Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation is the oldest program of the American Legion Auxiliary started in 1919. Since World War I the American Legion Auxiliary has taken an active role in the care and rehabilitation of veteran patients. In 1930 the Veterans Administration program was started to create a formal healthcare program. At the end of World War II they decided to focus their time, skill and effort helping care for a new group of men and women now known as veterans.

There are many ways to help our veterans. You can sew quilts for the Quilts of Valor Foundation. You can crochet stocking hats, scarves or mittens for the homeless veteran. You can also provide food items or volunteer for a local stand-down (next stand-down is in Rapid City on 11/10/16) or helping with Bingo night is always appreciated. And you can do something that doesn't cost anything by cutting up plastic bags to be crocheted into mats for the homeless veterans. Don't forget about the Community Based Outpatient Clinics. You can provide little gifts for the veterans & their families such as art supplies to keep the kids occupied or coffee supplies. The American Legion Auxiliary is a cosponsor of the VA Creative Arts so our participation is important for this program. Find out what the veteran artists project needs might be and donate supplies needed. Every little bit helps and means a lot.

Contact homeless shelters, transitional and permanent housing projects to identify their needs. These settings will benefit greatly from clothing and food drives, hygiene kits, buddy baskets and donations of household items and furniture. And, above all, you can supply moral support. Because of the vital role each Auxiliary volunteer plays in the successful care and rehabilitation of veterans, the ALA has adopted the Code of Ethics to guide us in our service. <u>Confidentially</u>, <u>professional behavior</u>, and <u>appropriate dress</u> per facility is expected, and most of all those served will, under all conditions and circumstances, be treated with the compassion, dignity and respect they have earned and deserve.

Don't forget the upcoming Christmas gift shops for the veterans in each facility in November and the Christmas Parties in December. Please bring trial-size personal care items such as toothpaste, , individually packaged toothbrushes, deodorant, lotion, etc. to Mid-Winter Conference to given to the VA's. Flip Flops can also be used as shower shoes.
