Midwinter Convention Speaker Virginia Nelsen Northwest Division Vice President

Virginia Nelsen of Valentine was installed as 2016 – 2017 Northwestern Division National Vice President in Cincinnati Ohio at the American Legion and Auxiliary National Convention. Nelsen has served on all levels in the American Legion Auxiliary: Unit 90 President for eleven years; District One President; President of the Department of Nebraska, National Public Relations Chairman and was also elected as National Historian in 2007/2008. Her service to the national organization spans fourteen years.

Responsibilities of divisional vice president include promoting the ALA mission: "...the spirit of service not self for Veterans, God and Country." It includes representing National President Mary Davis when needed; facilitating leadership, and enlisting membership for a strong voice in Washington DC. Nelsen is a life member of both the ALA and the VFW.



She is eligible for membership through her grandfather WWI Naval veteran William Houwen, her father Army Air Corps Flying Tigers Warren Walker, husband 82nd Airborne veteran Donald Nelsen, and son Air Force Master Sergeant Bill Nelsen. Americanism by Dept. Chairman Jacqueline (Jacki) Omland

What can you do? 1. Be knowledgeable on flag history, etiquette and proper disposal methods; and promote the observation of patriotic holidays so your community will look to the ALA for information. Go into the classroom and teach our next generation about the flag. One of the best sources for flag etiquette is http:// www.usflag.org/flagetiquette.html . Work with your Legion to put on Veterans Day and Memorial Day programs. Have a float in parades. Sponsor a 4th of July celebration. 2. Encourage members to vote and to support the amendment to protect the United States flag from desecration. The amendment currently reads, "The Congress shall have power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States." Help drive people to the polling places. Help with voter registration and help at the polls on Election Day. 3. Increase participation in the Americanism Essay Contest. This year's theme is "How does learning about government and our America help you become a future guardian of the liberties of our country?" 4. Increase participation in the SD Americanism Poetry Contest. This is only a South Dakota Competition so there are no National Awards. This year's title is "Have you Hugged A veteran Today?" Poems and Essays are due: March 1, 2017: to units from the schools. Local awards are at the discretion of the Unit; March 15, 201: to District Presidents from the Units. Units please only send your first place entry to the District President. District awards are at the discretion of the Districts: April 1, 2017: To the Department Chairman. District Presidents, please send only your first place entry in each category to the Department Chairman. 5. Participate in the promotion of American Legion Americanism programs such as Legion Baseball and their Oratorical Contest. 6. Remember to report everything your unit does on the year-end report which is due to your District President by April 15, 2017.
