ALA SD Girls State Journalism

The DEADLINE for the ALA SD Girls State Journalism City is FEB-RUARY 1, 2016! Please contact the schools to see if they may have someone that would be interested in Journalism City even though the school may not have a school newspaper. The acceptance letters for Journalism City will be mailed out by FEB-RUARY 21, 2016. The reason for the February deadline is if the girl does not get selected for Journalism City she can still apply for the regular session.

The Journalism City application process is the same as in the past. The application forms were mailed to the Unit Presidents in the October Department mailing. If you do not have a form, please contact me and one will be provided.

To increase the interest, we are making some modifications to Journalism City for the 2016 session. The applicants will still need to complete the application form as well as provide a letter of recommendation and samples of a news story, a feature and or an editorial. If they are on staff with the school newspaper, they should include a copy of that as well.

The goal is to accept fourteen girls in Journalism City but each girl will also be assigned to a regular city so that she can sign petitions, vote by computer, etc. and be involved in various activities throughout the week. She won't be able to run for any

offices as her primary objective for the week will be to produce the *Sacajawea Scroll*. But by being part of a city it will give the girls a broader Girls State experience.

We will also be adding a lunch/roundtable discussion for the Journalism City delegates. Each day Tuesday through Friday a different source of the media will be invited to join the girls for lunch such as radio, TV, newspaper and magazine. It will give the girls a chance to network with professional staff in each of those areas.

As noted in my ALA SD Girls State Fall bulletin we will be moving to an <u>online registration</u> process. Complete instructions on this will be included in the application packets that will be sent out the middle of January. Unless we received the Unit Data Form to inform us who is to receive the packet, the packet will automatically be mailed to the Unit President. So if it is to be mailed to someone other than the President, you need to let me know ASAP.

This year the Samsung application is also moving to an on line registration and more information will also be included in the application packets.

We have lots of new and exciting things planned for the 2016 session and we need your help to contact those delegates so we can have a record breaking attendance!
