The 71st annual ALA SD Girls State will be May 29 – June 3, 2017 on the campus of The University of South Dakota, Vermillion. Auxiliary Day is scheduled for Friday, June 2nd!

The Journalism City applications were mailed to the units in the December President's packets from Department Headquarters. If you have not contacted your schools please do soon as possible as we are still accepting applications. Besides Journalism City, each girl will also be assigned to a regular city. She will not be able to run for any offices as her primary objective for the week will be to produce the Sacajawea Scroll. But, by being part of a regular city and Journalism City, it will give the girls a broader ALA Girls State experience.

There will be a lunch/roundtable discussion for the Journalism City delegates. Tuesday through Friday a different source of the media (radio, TV, newspaper, magazine) will be invited to join the girls for lunch. It will give the girls a chance to network with professional staff in each of those areas.

Pre-registration packets have been mailed to the units. If the unit data sheet was not returned notifying us where the material should be sent, it was automatically sent to the Unit President. Final registration will be done online so be sure to read the instructions closely.

It is the responsibility of each Unit to make the final selection for all ALA SD the Poppy items that have been made for the Sen- Girls State Citizens. Units must work with the schools to outline our program including qualifications needed for participation. Ask schools for a list of students fitting our criteria, but make it clear that the American Legion Auxiliary sponsors ALA Girls State and the final selection rests with the Unit. There is no Unit quota so if you have several delegates that are interested in attending, but you do not have the funding, be sure to ask businesses and organizations in your community if they would be willing to help sponsor or co-sponsor a delegate. Please advise the delegates that <u>no</u> permission will be granted to attend other activities during the session and to receive awards. The FULL session must be attended. If a girl chooses not to attend and there is no alternate, the delegate is responsible for reimbursing the Unit for the registration fee.

Strategic Plan Goal 4: Strengthen Department and Units

Strategy 1: *Increase Attendance at Fall and Spring District Meetings*; Initiative: Provide financial incentive to the District with largest % of attendance. This initial initiative evolved in providing incentives for membership to build member capacity and strengthen the department.

Strategy 2: *Invest in Training*; Our department emphasizes on training following the initial initiative: Junior meetings at all district and state meetings. Since the plan was developed, District Presidents offered workshops, the Dept. President developed District Presidents' orientation handbooks, training guides for dept. chairmen, and conducts monthly conference calls with District Pres. and officers. Strengthening and remodeling the department website provides current information for our membership.

Strategy 3: *Create "Plan of Actions" at the Unit Level*; Initiative: Provide department mailings and information on a timely schedule. Encourage District Presidents to be the liaison between the department and the units.

Goal 4 will be the focus in 2017-2018. As a department, new initiatives are helping members to work towards these initial strategies. Moving forward, new ideas and strategies will evolve in response to the voice of the units to strengthen our department.

- 2. All entries must use the ALA Poppy, large small or a combination

- 4. Accessories, greenery, and filler may be used but the Poppy must be predominant
- 5. Each entry must have the following information attached behind or under the arrangement hidden from the view of the judges: (a) the member's name and auxiliary number, (b) the name and number of the member's unit, (c) the category of the entry


District Workshops

The District 2 workshop focused on making **Prayers Pillow** for comforting the veterans hurting whether from being hospitalized, in long-term care, or grieving. The pillow may be any shape, but try to keep it simple and



smaller. They must be made of soft, washable material such as flannel or fleece. Dept. Chaplain Shelley Dragoo made some out of old flannel shirts. The pocket must be the size of (at least) a business card and must be well sewn on and the stuffing must be washable—preferably a synthetic-type. The "prayers" should be short and uplifting. Keep it ecumenical in nature and focus on positive thoughts. You can do up to 5 cards with sayings on front and back. The font needs to be easy to read and a larger type—some of the folks receiving these have very challenging eyesight.

The District 8 workshop highlighted one of the **Americanism** programs, flag etiquette, rules, and code. Participants also practiced the flag folding ceremony, and made patriotic gift bags.



The Box Elder **Coats for Vets** drive led by the newly formed American Legion Riders and the help of Unit 315 President Erika Adams collected and donated over 300 jackets and cold weather gear for the veterans in town.
