#### ALA SD GIRLS STATE UPDATE Cheryl Hovorka

ALA GIRLS STATE DIRECTOR/CHAIRMAN

At the 2017 American Legion Auxiliary Midwinter Conference the Finance Committee and the Executive Board unanimously voted to dissolve the ALA SD Girls State Corporation and Board of Directors. Even though at this time, the National organization is not requiring the Departments to dissolve the ALA Girls State Corporations/Board of Directors, it was strongly advised that the Departments take it under consideration.

There will be no changes to the program itself except the administrative duties will now be handled by the ALA Department Secretary and ALA Department Treasurer.

The registration fee paid by the Units for their ALA Girls State delegates remains the same and it should be sent to the ALA Girls State Registrar along with the pre-registration forms. The ALA Girls State Registrar will forward checks to the ALA Department Head-quarters on a weekly basis.

The ALA SD Girls State Director/ Chairman will be one person and the addition of an Assistant ALA SD Girls State Director/Chairman has been created. The requirements for these two positions shall be:

- 1) must be members of the American Legion Auxiliary,
- 2) must be past ALA Girls State delegates, and
- 3) must have extensive knowledge and experience in planning and facilitating the program.

The Director/Chairman will be appointed by the incoming ALA Department President and following the ALA Department's Strategic Plan, the Director/Chairman will appoint the Assistant Director/Chairman and the ALA Girls State Committee.

The format used will follow that of the ALA Girls Nation Committee and only the committee will spend the week at the session but all members are welcome to come for a day and volunteer in the store. ALA Day will be Friday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> and reservations may be made for the banquet by contacting the ALA SD Girls State Director.

## Member to Remember SOLE HOPE



In December 2016, Jennifer Loosmore, daughter of Carol Luebke, Auxiliary President of unit 48. Rosholt and member of the local Bethania church women's group, organized a "shoe cutting party" at

the local church called "SOLE HOPE'. The upper portions of these shoes are made from old blue jeans and milk jugs. After all the items are cut, pieces for 5 pairs of shoes were placed in a plastic bag, then shipped to Africa to be attached to soles made from locally recycled tires. These shoes would then be given to children that did not have any to wear to help keep their feet free

A group of about 20 women, including 5 youth, made 31 pairs of size 5 shoes, that children in Africa would now be able to wear. A cookie exchange was also done at that time.
