These veterans are so appreciative not only for the additional income, but also for the support of Auxiliary members and the feeling that they are contributing to a worthwhile cause. Poppy Room treats are also a drawing factor!

The American Legion Family will launch National Poppy Day on Friday, May 26,

as a way to honor U.S. servicemembers, from the battlefields of France in WWI a century ago to today's global war on terrorism.

(IN MEMORIAM (A)

After World War I, the poppy flourished in Europe and quickly became a symbol of the sacrifices made by Americans and allied servicemembers around the world. Soldiers returning from WWI brought home the flowers in memory of the barren landscape transformed by the sudden growth of wild red poppies among the newly dug graves — unforgetta-

bly described in a memorial poem by Canadian Lt. Col. John McCrae:

If ye break faith with us who die We shall not sleep, though poppies gr

We shall not sleep, though poppies grow In Flanders Fields.

National Poppy Day broadens a tradition that dates back to the American Legion Auxiliary's first National Convention in the early 1920s when the red poppy was adopted as The American Legion Family's memorial flower. Today, it remains an iconic symbol of honor for the sacrifice of our veterans. ALA members distribute millions of poppies annually across the country in exchange for donations that go directly to assist disabled and hospitalized veterans in our communities. Boeing Co. is a sponsor of National Poppy Day. American Legion Auxiliary National President Mary E. Davis and American Legion National Commander Charles E. Schmidt encourage all Americans to wear or display poppies on National Poppy Day in memory of the fallen and to honor those who have fought for freedom. "https://www.alaforveterans.org/poppy/"



## **Local Veterans Pay Tribute to Past Heroes of World War II**

Normandy, France -- members of American Legion Homestake Post 31 in Lead took part in a ceremony to honor the members of the armed services who took part in the invasion of Normandy in June 1944.

On May 9, two members of the American Legion Homestake Post 31 and auxiliary unit 31 later reef in a ceremony at the Normandy American Cemetery at Collville-sur-Mer, France.

Adjutant Glori Davis and finance officer Denise Parker place the wreath at the base of the 22 foot Memorial bronze monument called "The Spirit of American Youth Rising from the Waves".

The bronze monument, which faces toward the headstones, reminds visitors of the young age of most of the participants of the Normandy battles in the weeks following D-Day.

The cemetery holds the remains of 9387 American servicemen and women who died during what was called Operation Overlord. The Allied invasion of Europe eventually succeeded in defeating the Axis powers. But the effort came at a cost of tens of thousands of lives. Many of the members of the Armed Forces who died were laid to rest in European cemeteries and remain there today. The Normandy American Cemetery is one of the many places that hold the remains.

May 8 and 9 are observed by the Western powers as VE-Day, or the day commemorating Victory in Europe.

American Legion Post 31 still has a living member who participated in the D-Day landings of June 6, 1944. On that day Mel Carlson was a 21 year old Sailor aboard a PT boat during the invasion. The Legion members collected sand from Omaha Beach and presented Mel that sand and a D-Day hat on June 6, 2017.
