

Dear South Dakota ALA Members,

Just as a reminder, the National Executive Committee for the American Legion Auxiliary meets face to face three times a year. We have a Post Convention meeting at National Convention to ratify the National Appointments along with the National Secretary and National Treasurer. We also approve the first spending budget for the year and receive a comparison of what last year's income and expenditures were and what is anticipated for the coming year. We have a mid-year meeting in February and a Preconvention meeting at National Convention. The position of NEC has three main responsibilities.  $\underline{#1}$  is a fiduciary responsibility on the National Level to make sure there are funds for the National level to meet all of its obligations and be able to maintain the finances it takes to meet the day to day needs of maintaining our organization. (This also includes investments for reserve funds that would keep our organization running for at least two years).  $\underline{#2}$  to be the voice for our members on the national level and your liaison to National organization, and  $\underline{#3}$  makes sure that our department is doing things in accordance with what the National Organization expects of all of the Departments in this organization.

Well this has not only been an interesting summer, but one that was a learning experience, so I will start by telling you what has happen since June and bring you up to our National Convention in Reno Nevada last week pertaining to the National Executive Committee.

It started in July with an e-mail from the National Secretary saying that we were about to embark on a electronic vote on two topics. #1 a dues raise and #2 the purchase of a building to house our National Office instead of renewing a ten year contract on the office space. This e-mail was followed two days later by another that further explained both topics, a conference call with the National Executive Committee and a electronic vote.

#1) The Dues Raise of three dollars for two years starting in 2019 and a cost of living raise (COLA) when needed, approved by the NEC's. <u>(I will give you an explanation of this COLA raise at our</u> <u>Mid Winter Conference, but because it failed at convention it seems trivial at this point)</u>

#2) National found a building they could buy that is adequate for the needs of the National Staff and future meetings and since our 10 year contract on the current offices we rent will be up the end of the year, it seemed a perfect time to buy this building that is valued at \$2,280,000 and our purchase price would be \$2,080,000. At any rate, after much discussion both passed by the NEC's. The dues raise would be brought before the delegation at National Convention and if everything went as planned National would move into new offices in Indianapolis in February of 2018. *(again, a further explanation of this will be given at Mid Winter and I will bring pictures to show everyone).* Both topics were voted on with the dues raise to go before the National Delegation to be voted on, and for National to go forward with the purchase of the building (with approval from the National Finance Committee and the NEC's).

I sent information out to our officers, District Presidents, Secretary, and as many of our Delegates going to National as I had e-mails for, so that everyone would have this information and could discuss it at the National Convention.

Now this brings us to the Convention in Reno Nevada. The \$3 dues raise passed and will go into effect in the 2018-2019 year. The Cost of living raise (COLA) was defeated, and the NEC's passed in their Pre-convention meeting to accept a "Code of Conduct" presented by National that will go out to the Departments as soon as National feels it is complete.

In the approved budget for 2017-2018 the National organization of the ALA <u>will not be</u> attending the *Washington DC conference*, and they will move the Mid Winter NEC conference to Indianapolis on February 24 and 25, 2018. They did make clear that Auxiliary members were still welcome to attend the conference in Washington and sit in on the American Legion's Legislative Sessions. This decision was made due to the declining attendance the Auxiliary had in Washington and the cost of conference to the Auxiliary.

That pretty much raps it up for now, and I hope to see many of you in Oacoma in February at the Mid Winter conference. In the meantime please feel free to contact me anytime if you have any questions or concerns you would like taken to the National level.

It is truly my pleasure to serve as your Department National Committeewoman and report back to you what happens at the National Executive meetings.
