Midwinter Conference: Senior Poppy Contest

Categories: Centerpiece, Tray Favors, Corsages, etc.

- 1. A Senior member may enter any or all of the categories.
- 2. All entries must use the American Legion Auxiliary poppy—large, small, or a combination.
- 3. The white label of the small poppy must be removed.
- 4. Accessories, greenery, and filler may be used BUT the poppy must be predominant.
- 5. Each entry must have the following information attached behind or under the arrangement, hidden from immediate view of the judges:
 - a. The member's name and Auxiliary ID number
 - b. The name and number of the Member's Unit
 - c. The category of the entry
- 6. All work must be done by the Unit member entering the contest.
- 7. Entries will be judged at Midwinter and should be checked in by 8:00 am, Saturday, February 17th, 2018.
- 8. Entries will be judged using the following criteria:
 - a. 25% Labeling, proper materials, following directions
 - b. 50% Predominance of the Poppy
 - c. 25% Design and creativity
