The 72<sup>nd</sup> annual ALA SD Girls State will be May 28 – June 2, 2018 on the campus of The University of South Dakota, Vermillion.

The Journalism City applications were mailed to Units in the December President's packets from Department Headquarters. If you have not contacted your schools please do soon as possible as we are still accepting applications. Besides Journalism City, each girl will also be assigned to a regular city. She will not be able to run for any offices as her primary objective for the week will be to produce the *Sacajawea Scroll*. But, by being part of a regular city and Journalism City, it will give the girls a broader ALA Girls State experience.

There will be a lunch/roundtable discussion for the Journalism City delegates. Tuesday through Friday a different source of the media (radio, TV, newspaper, magazine) will be invited to join the girls for lunch. It will give girls a chance to network with professional staff in each of those areas.

Pre-registration packets have been mailed to the Units. If the Unit data sheet was not returned notifying us where the material should be sent, it was automatically sent to the Unit President. Final registration will be done online so be sure to read the instructions closely.

It is the responsibility of each Unit to make the final selection for all ALA SD Girls State Citizens. Units must work with the schools to outline our program including qualifications needed for participation. Ask schools for a list of students fitting our criteria, but make it clear that the American Legion Auxiliary sponsors ALA Girls State and the final selection rests with the Unit. There is no Unit quota so if you have several delegates that are interested in attending, but you do not have the funding, be sure to ask businesses and organizations in your community if they would be willing to help sponsor or co-sponsor a delegate. Please advise the delegates that no permission will be granted to attend other activities during the session and to receive awards. The FULL session must be attended. If a girl chooses not to attend and there is no alternate, the delegate is responsible for reimbursing the Unit for the registration fee.

The delegates will have the opportunity to register for a three-credit course entitled POLS 210: State and Local Government.

# THE COURSE IS STRICLY OPTIONAL AND THE DELEGATES ARE NOT REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE.

The delegate may take it as a dual credit (with approval of her high school counselor) or as college credit. The course is scheduled for 6-8 weeks, which includes online and face-to-face classes during the week of ALA Girls State. The cost of the course will depend on whether it is taken as dual credit or college credit. If a delegate is interested in getting more information on the course, there will be a box on the online registration form she can check to indicate her interest. Dr. Matthew Fairholm, Professor in the USD Department of Political Science, will be the teaching the course.
