The Community Service Program promotes the American Legion Auxiliary's visibility within our localities through our commitment to community, state, and nation. By being visible in our localities, the Community Service Program demonstrates who we are, what we do, and why we matter. Work with and invite other organizations to work on service projects to heighten awareness of the America Legion Auxiliary's local efforts to support our veterans, service members, their families, and the community.

Every activity that your unit does, should be reported in your year-end report. If the activity does not seem to fit under any other program, report it under community service. Volunteer at local libraries, food pantries, domestic violence shelters, senior citizen shelters, assisted living centers, and nursing homes. Work with your post to offer space and their participation in local service projects and causes.

Remember to always be a visible representative of the Auxiliary. You can do this by wearing an Auxiliary vest, shirt, pin, or emblem.

A Unit Community Service Award will be presented by Department to the most outstanding program during the 2017-2018 year. Entries must include the cover sheet that was included in one of your packets from Department. Please sent entries to me by May 1, 2018.

Also, PLEASE summarize the reports from your units—do not report about what each unit does and <u>do not send</u> the chairman ALL of the unit reports.

"This first puppet show is about the Pledge of Allegiance. It's something many of us have recited without even thinking about what we are saying. And there are some big words in it that elementary kids don't understand. So this puppet show explains what those words mean and what the pledge itself means," Noelle Bonjour said. "Because puppets are nonthreatening, they capture a child's attention in ways that adults cannot."
