The Education Program promotes the American Legion Auxiliary's role in providing quality education for children and adults through classroom activities, literacy programs, scholarship promotion, and support of education beyond high school, especially for military children.

Support your local schools by participating in Give 10 to Education, American Education Week, and Teacher Appreciation Week. Every unit should be able to earn a Give 10 to Education Award. Many units give dictionaries to the third graders in their local school. Other ideas: give 10 pencils or 10 notebooks, give 10 boxes of Kleenex or 10 bottles of hand sanitizer, give 10 pairs of mittens or 10 pairs of socks, give \$10 to pay for school lunches for children who cannot afford lunch, etc. After completing this project, please send me the Give 10 to Education Report.

Promote American Legion Auxiliary scholarships at the Department and National level and, if you can, award a local scholarship. The applications for the Department scholarships were sent in the first mailing. For the National Scholarships, you can find them on the web site. All of these are due to your unit Education Chairman by March 1, 2019.

Assist and support you local veterans pursuing higher or vocational education. Also, remember the military children and help them with educational opportunities.

Remember to always be a visible representative of the Auxiliary. You can do this by wearing an Auxiliary vest, shirt, pin, or emblem.
