Categories: Wreaths, Centerpiece, Tray Favors, Corsages, Photographs, etc.

**Eligibility:** A Senior member may enter any or all of the categories.

All entries must use the American Legion Auxiliary poppy-large, small or a combination

The white label of the small poppy must be removed.

Accessories greenery and filler may be used BUT the poppy must be pre-

Each entry must have the following information attached behind or under the arrangement hidden from immediate view of the judge:

- The member's name and Auxiliary ID number
- The name and number of the Member's Unit
- The category for the entry
- All work must be done by the Unit member entering the con-
- Entries will be judged at Mid-Winter and should be checked in by 8:00 AM Saturday, February 9th, 2019

Entries will be judged using the following criteria:

- 25% Labeling, proper materials, following directions
- 50% Predominance of the Poppy
- 25% Design and creativity

Current membership dues must be paid; years of membership are not a part of the criteria; nominee may be a new member; all entry forms, including a narrative (limited to 1,000 words), must be completed and submitted by March 15th or prior to the Spring District meeting whichever comes first. District Presidents' deadline to the department chairman is May 1st.

The unit president and secretary must sign the entry form unless the nominee is one of them, in which case a past unit president must sign the entry form.

The selection of the winner is at the discretion of the Department Past President's Parley Chairman. The department winner is encouraged to attend the National Convention.
