





The Official Presidential Pin of Teresa Huntimer has elements with specific meanings:

- The Auxiliary crest is atop the pin to show my dedication to the mission of this organization.
- The circular shape of the main field signifies never-ending dedication to Always Remembering our veterans.
- The outer ring is purple representing all five military branches
- 4. The inner gold circle is representative of the sun and signifies hope on the horizon for resolution of our POW/MIA
- 5. The Battlefield Cross is in remembrance of our fallen, and it faces right to signify the eternal search for peace.
- The four poppies at the bottom represent each of the four pillars of the Auxiliary's mission; Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children & Youth.


