A tireless worker who puts her heart into everything she does.

For her hard work, the Winner Area Chamber of Commerce has named Wilcox as the volunteer of the year.

Due to COVID-19 there was no annual banquet or awards presentation.

Wilcox was surprised with the award at a Chamber board meeting on Jan. 20. She thought she was coming to the Chamber to help Liz Farley with a RSVP project. But much to her surprise, Wilcox was the center of attention with the award presentation.

Wilcox goes above and beyond to keep the new Legion building spotless. During the summer, she mows several lawns for veterans. And when the snow starts to fly, she cleans driveways for veterans.

The Honor Guard is an important part of the veteran organizations in Winner. Wilcox organizes a supper for the Honor Guard. She also organizes miscellaneous luncheons, soup suppers for many occasions. She also has served several funeral luncheons for deceased veterans, organized cake and ice cream for volunteers of the Thrift Store.

Wilcox is secretary/treasurer of the Winner Legion Auxiliary. In this capacity she sends items to the state organization that need to be filed. She also sends a reminder to members to pay their yearly dues.

She helps the auxiliary furnish candy for Trunk or Treat at the Methodist Church.

Wilcox keeps up with scholarship information and makes sure the school has the scholarship applications.

For Memorial Day, Wilcox manages the ladies who put poppies on crosses

for the veterans at the cemetery.

When Government Day rolls around in the spring, Wilcox works with the Legion in organizing this day and then helps serve a lunch to the students.

Wilcox drives veterans as needed to doctor appointments in Winner, Gregory and even Sturgis or Hot Springs.

# National K-9 Veterans

National K9 Veterans Day is celebrated on March 13th on the official birthday of the US Army K9 Corps, which was formed in 1942. Joseph White, a retired military working dog trainer, orig-

inated the idea for the day. March 13th recognizes National K9 Veterans Day and the dedicated K9 units who've served since World War II.

A lot of things changed after the bombing of Pearl Harbor in 1941.

Dogs were called to duty. During the first world war, the United States took notice of the European use of canines as sentries, message carriers, and several other functions.

A private citizen, Mrs. Alene Erlanger initiated a program called Dogs for Defense. Along with the American Kennel Club and a handful of breeders, the group aimed to train the dogs for military use.

By November of 1942, the military prepared the first Dogs for Defense for duty in North Africa. While at first, they were gun shy, they proved to be well trained.

As the war progressed, Dogs for Defense was unable to keep up with the demand, and the Remount Branch, Service Installations Divisions took over the training of the dogs.

Over the years, the military, police, and rescue have developed a variety of training methods for K9 units.
