Peanut Bark Candy

Something sweet for the spouses who stands in support of their soldier or veteran. They understand their inner thoughts, wants to make them go away, and know all they can do is be their support.

2 pounds white candy coating 1 cup Peanut Butter 3 cups crisp rice cereal

2 cups dry roasted peanuts 2 cups mini marshmallows

Melt the candy coating in a double -boiler and stir until smooth. Add peanut butter and mix well. Stir in the three remaining ingredients and drop onto waxed paper. Allow to set for an hour. Make about 9 – 10 dozen candies.



Rapíd Cíty Stand Down

The American Legion Family united at the Rapid City Stand Down to provide services, information and personal items to homeless and disadvantaged veterans! Rapid City Post #22 American Legion, Auxiliary and American Legion Riders, Hermosa Post #303 Auxiliary, Watertown Auxiliary Unit #17, Box Elder Unit #315 Auxiliary, Spearfish Unit #164 Auxiliary, and the Black Hills Chapter Post 164 of the American Legion Riders, came and set up eight tables. This year, the Spearfish Unit 164 of the American Legion Auxiliary focused on items specifically for female veterans. The unit had a budget of \$550 to plan for 25 female veterans and found out that the need was real. It was the first time that



a table was set specifically for females. In addition, the Spearfish Middle School and the Spearfish High School collected over 300 warm hats and 300 insulated gloves. On that day, 230 veterans came through the doors. They are vetted by the VA and receive a ticket to allow them to go through the fifty booths and tables set-up between 10:00 am and 2:00 pm. This event is an annual event organized by the VA that takes place at the Rapid City Civic Center, the week before Veterans Day.
