Grease and flour 9 X 13-inch pan, place 1 quart of cut rhubarb in with above ingredients.

Spread in 9 X 13-inch pan, sprinkle with 1 cup of sugar and nutmeg mix (about 1 ¹/₂ tsp nutmeg).

Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

A small vendors' show was hosted by Pierre Unit 8 on Saturday January 25th at the Pierre Legion Cabin. Patsy Madsen nominated one of local Veteran John Fette to receive a quilt from Quilts of Valor QOV.) The quilt was presented to John Fette at noon during their vendors' show. They had a fundraiser for QOV to raise monies for Quilts of Valor for supplies etc. to make more quilts for our Veterans. The first vendors' show had 15 vendors along with the unit's table. The unit also served sloppy joes, chips and soda for lunch. They raised \$270 from vendors' table fees and the unit matched it. They gave QOV \$540.00 towards their mission of making quilts for veterans.







Pierre area veteran Lance Corporal John Fette was honored with a quilt at the American Legion Hall in Pierre, Saturday, Jan. 25. According to records provided by Marlin and Ardys Roseland, Fette served in Area — 1 Corp 3rd Marine Infantry Division as an anti-tank assault person and military occupation specialist in Vietnam, from February 1969 through June 1969. Fette received numerous medals for his service. These include the Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Combat Action Ribbon and a Purple Heart Medal. Lance Corporal Fette medically retired from the Marine Corp. Upon coming home, he further served with the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs. He currently works part-time at the South Dakota National Guard Museum and serves as the chaplain for the American Legion Post 8 and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2038. Awarding of the quilt was made by members of the Flag Mountain Honor Guard, South Dakota's first Quilt of Valor Foundation chapter, located in Pierre. Membership in the group is drawn from quilters throughout the state and is open to anyone wishing to make quilts to honor the state's South Dakota veterans.
