Reports, Awards, & Information from National By NEC Laura (Susie) Clyde

Due to the Pandemic, things have changed a bit on the National Level and I am going to try to inform all of you of as much of this as I can. The following information you should know going forward for the rest of this year and next year.

<u>YEAR-END REPORTS</u> - members send to Unit, Unit sends to District President, District President send impact number to Department Secretary and Department President, who in turn sends impact numbers to National. (Impact numbers are Veterans served, Volunteer hours, and money spent) This is then sent to the National American Legion who submits in the Congress.

No narrative reports will be turned into National Chairman this year. Instead the Mid-Year reports that will be sent to National Next year (National Deadline is January 5, 2021) will be for all of the 2020 year and the first half of the 2020-2021 year.

<u>Americanism Essays</u> will be awarded both this year and next year...This deadline has already passed for this year (4/15) Topic will be the same next year as this year.

<u>Children and Youth:</u> Youth Hero and Good Deed awards are ongoing and will continue this year and next year. This also applies to the Give 10 program.

Membership: incentive awards will continue to be awarded this year and the same awards will apply to next year with the Calendar dates being changed.

<u>Juniors</u> will still submit their 2019-2020 member of the year, and the winner will be honored next year along with next year's winner. The Divisional Junior Vice Presidents will still be picked for next year. Any junior that attended the Mission Training session can submit a "Intent to run form". This will be sent out this summer to those that qualify.

<u>Past President Parley:</u> Unit Member of the year and Service Women of the Year will not be honored this year on the National level. (DEC will decide what to do on the Department level)

<u>Poppy:</u> Poppy Posters will be judged both this year and next year, so make sure you get your poppy poster into the Poppy Chairman. Little Miss Poppy will also be award both this year and next year, both winners will be invited to next year's National Convention.

Sweet breads

Treats for ourselves, because we have worked so hard this year meeting our membership goals. We have recruited everyone we know from every avenue we can find to be a member. The first is a "cake mix" recipe that you can substitute with any flavor of cake mix.

Pistachio (Cake Mix) Bread

1 pkg yellow cake mix (Lemon for lemon bread, spice for a spice bread, etc); 1 pkg instant pistachio pudding; 4 eggs; 1 cup sour cream; 4 cup oil; ½ cup nuts (optional)

Spray bread pan with Pam, dust pans with a mixture of cinnamon and sugar.

Bake 350 degrees 45 min.

Banana Bread

1 egg; 2 cups flour; ¼ cup oil; ½ tsp baking powder; 3 Tbls milk ½ tsp salt; ¾ cup sugar; ½ tsp soda; 2 – 3 cups mashed bananas ;1 cup nuts (optional)

Mix well Bake 350 degrees for 1 hour

Points to Ponder about Poppies

With National Poppy Day coming soon, I thought I'd give you some information about the poppy program. Veterans assemble poppies for the American Legion Auxiliary. Poppies were first used following WWI to decorate graves for fallen soldiers. The ALA Poppy Program became one of our national programs in 1924. In 2017, National Poppy Day was established the Friday before Memorial Day. Our poppies are made by veterans from the Hot Springs VA. Money from poppies can only be used to help veterans. They are made by veterans and any funds collected during poppy distribution must be used for veterans.

I will give some examples of the cost involved in the program. I will use 1,000 poppies as my example. When you order poppies, if you purchase 1,000, it cost you \$225. It costs the Department to purchase the kits and labels for these poppies approximately \$80, depending on shipping charges. The veteran gets \$100 for making 1,000 poppies. That is 10 cents a poppy. As you can see, this adds up to \$180.00. We also have to mail the poppies to your unit. A 1,000 poppies will cost \$30-\$50, depending on whether it takes 1 or 2 boxes, the size of the boxes and the distance. If there is any money left, it goes into the Department Poppy fund.

When you send in your 25% from your poppy distribution/donations to Department, this money also goes into the Department Poppy fund. This money has to be used for projects for veterans. Special requests for these funds need to go through the Executive Board. This year, some funds were taken out of the Department fund to help a veteran who was chosen to go to the National Veterans Creative Arts festival from South Dakota. It was used to pick up some charges that the Veterans Creative Arts didn't cover, such as the charge to ship his guitar.

Your unit should be keeping the 75% collected from poppy distribution separate, not in your general fund, to be used for helping veterans in your area. Poppies can be distributed at any time, not just Memorial Day. I know several units that distribute them around Veterans Day also. I hope this clears up some questions you might have about the Poppy Program.

Poppy Posters Information

I thought I had cleared up some misunderstandings with due dates on the poppy posters, but not all dates were changed. Posters are due to the Department Poppy Chairman by May 15. Do not send them to District Presidents. I know with schools closing because of the Coronavirus, getting posters turned in might be a challenge. Please do the best you can. I have received notice that National is still continuing with the contest. Thank you.
