Guest speakers at our September American Legion Auxiliary meeting, were Katie Hun-



hoff, Editor of South Dakota Magazine, who introduced her father, Bernie Hunhoff. Bernie was the former owner of The South Dakota Magazine and he talked about some "Good People" of South Dakota that he had interviewed. Sig Anderson who served as State Attorney General and then as Governor of South Dakota. Gladys Pyle was the first woman elected to the Senate and then served as Secretary of State. Ben Reifel was born on Rosebud Reservation and became the first Lakota Sioux elected to Congress. Arne Larson was a fervent collector of musical instruments and opened the Shrine of Music at USD. Sidney Milburn operated the Milburn Veterinary Clinic in Elk Point. He was the first black veterinarian in the Midwest. Clyde Ice was known as a great pilot who took great risks in snow blizzards to safe sick people. Bernie added some very interesting stories about these Good People of South Dakota.
