Membership by Rose Kraft, SD Dept. Chairman


#### Auxiliary world,



## ALA National Poppy Day® Friday, May 26, 2023

#### What is the Poppy Program, and why do we have it?

"Connecting the visual image of the poppy with the sacrifice of service made by our veterans has been an important goal of the American Legion Auxiliary Poppy Program since its inception in 1921. On Memorial Day and Veterans Day, millions of red crepe paper poppies, handmade by Veterans as part of their therapeutic rehabilitation, are distributed across the country in exchange of donations that go directly to assist veterans in our com-



munities... The Poppy Program raises community awareness and respect for our veterans by educating auxiliary members and the public about the symbol of the poppy, taken from a line in the poem "In Flanders Fields" written on the battlefront during World War I by Lt. Col. John McCrae M.D.

National Poppy Day broadens a tradition that dates to the American Legion Auxiliary's first National Convention on September 27, 1920s when the red poppy was adopted as The American Legion Family's memorial flower. Today, it remains an iconic symbol of honor for the sacrifice of our veterans." (Adapted from Bridgette Greene, Florida Poppy Chairman)
